



Dear Parent/Guardian,

Many thanks to everyone who returned the Parent questionnaire, it is greatly appreciated. As you can see from the overview printed on the reverse of this sheet, your responses were overwhelmingly positive and for most of the statements, 100% of Parents responded that they agreed or strongly agreed with the statement.

Seven out of the fifteen statements showed a very small number of Parents who did not agree or did not know, so we would like to give you more information.

Q3. and Q10.

As part of our school, informing parents of their child's progress is a vital part of our school life. We have opening afternoons and evenings where parents are invited to work alongside their child/children and during these meetings it gives the teacher and yourself time to discuss the progress your child is making. Also at these meetings your child will receive individual targets for that term that they are working towards. If you feel you would like to find out more about your child's progress, please make an appointment to see their class teacher who will be more than happy to speak to you.

Q6.

Children receive weekly homework in both KeyStage1 and Reception. Nursery children will start receiving homework/WOW challenges next half term. They will also start taking their own special book bag home with a story in for you to share together. Homework is based around what the children have been learning about during that week in school. If you do have any questions regarding your child's homework please come along to our homework club on a Monday after school. Alongside this, the children in KeyStage1 and Reception are asked to try and read daily at home with you. They will take a book home that is suited to their ability in order for you to enjoy and to help develop their pace and fluency. If you have any questions or concerns regarding home readers please leave a comment in your child's reading record or speak to their class teacher.

Q9.

Here at our school we firmly believe in an open door policy and communication between school and yourselves is vital in ensuring that your child is happy and safe in school. If you do have any concerns or issues please come into school or ring and speak to Mrs Thompson (Head Teacher).

Q12.

In this half term we do only have two after school clubs; multi-sports and eco-club. After half term we will be adding more after school clubs for all age ranges. Please keep checking letters for after school club invitations and if you do have any other suggestions for clubs, we would love to hear from you.

Q13.

Here at our school we believe that eating well is important in helping children to develop a healthier lifestyle. Children need to eat well as it will give them energy and nutrients to grow and develop, be healthy and active. Please see our 'Healthy Eating' leaflet that your child came home with for more information. If you need an extra copy please just ask. During school, children learn about developing a healthy lifestyle in Science, PE, DT and every part of their school day. We encourage children to have a healthy lifestyle right from the beginning of the day. Children participate in a 10 minutes physical wake up, shake up and at least 2 hours of physical education which is set out in the Government guidelines.

Q14.

We are currently setting up a 'Friends of South Stanley Infant and Nursery School' who will help to organise events and raise valuable funds to help to pay for additional activities and resources across school. If this is something you are interested in joining, please keep checking our 'Friends of South Stanley' notice board. If you are interested in helping within school, for example reading with children or helping with creative activities, please see your child's teacher.

We hope that this information helps. We do appreciate that for some Parents new to our school, it might feel a little early to be able to answer some of the questions, but we will repeat the questionnaire later in the year and hope to gain a comparison. If you are still unsure, please do not hesitate to contact the Headteacher or your child's teacher who will be happy to talk to you.
