At South Stanley Infant & Nursery School, your child's right to come to school and learn is of utmost importance to us. We also value the role of Parents and believe that Parents have an enormous role to play in their children's education.

Literacy and phonics

Reading

Children read and understand simple sentences. They use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. They also read some common irregular words. They demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.



Writing

Children use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. They also write some irregular common words. They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words are spelt correctly and others are phonetically plausible.

In order to help you to support your child with his/her learning, we have produced this booklet which outlines the key things that your child should know and understand in Maths and English by the end of Reception. We hope that you find it useful.

Mathematics

Number

Children count reliably with numbers from one to 20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number. Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single-digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer. They solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.



Shape, space and measures

Children use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems. They recognise, create and describe patterns. They explore characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.

Homework

Reading— Research has shown that children who read every day are more successful in later life. We expect your child to read at home every night and reading books should be returned as soon as your child has finished his/her reading book.
